Implemented at North Carolina's Alamance Regional Medical Center (ARMC) in 1998, CPOE has helped the facility reduce medication errors by 72% and expedited the transmission of medication orders to pharmacy by 86 minutes.

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Computerized physician order entry (CPOE), which would be better called computerized prescriber order entry, is a method whereby instructions for treating of patients are entered into an electronic system by the prescriber and the orders are communicated over a computer network to the relevant staff whose responsibility it is to carry out the orders (64 c, 65 R). Other terms that are sometimes used include computerized provider order entry and computerized prescription order entry.
