CPT Code for Posterior Tibial Tendon Tear (Partial)

1) CPT 27605 (tenotomy, percutaneous, Achilles tendon [separate procedure]; local anesthesia); or 2) CPT 27606 (tenotomy, percutaneous, Achilles tendon [separate procedure]; general anesthesia); or 3) CPT 27687 (gastrocnemius recession) If you performed one of these procedures, send in a corrected claim with the appropriate procedure code, op report, and letter of explanation.

Posterior tibial tendon problems usually occur just underneath the prominence of the inner side of the ankle, called the medial malleolus. The medial malleolus is the end of the shin bone (the tibia) and the posterior tibial tendon wraps just underneath the medial malleolus.

Current Procedural Terminology - Tenotomy, open, extensor ...

A posterior tibial tendon transfer procedure can involve the posterior tibial tendon alone or transfer with two other tendons, the peroneus longus and the anterior tibialis. When all three tendons are used it is called a Bridle procedure. Multiple incisions are needed to move the tendon from one position to another.

Burghardt et al. noted that the patient had a posterior tibial artery-dependent foot. The child later required repeat tenotomy and, during the revision done by open tenotomy, the posterior tibial artery was noted to be closely applied to the Achilles tendon .

Simple tenotomy and anterior interosseous transfer have unpredictable outcomes, have been condemned and largely discarded [2, 16, 22, 28]. Intramuscular lengthening of the tibialis posterior is a popular procedure in the management of the varus foot in spastic cerebral palsy, and is considered to have more predictable results [1, 14, 28].

Achilles tenotomy is basically a percutaneous release of the entire Achilles tendon, which one performs with the patient in the supine position. Indications are few and mostly include patients with severe equinus who need permanent rigid ankle-foot orthotic bracing, those with recurrent equinus or clubfoot patients after serial casting. 12

The most common reason to have posterior tendon surgery is to correct pain and limited walking ability due to acquired flatfoot deformity.
